Thanks to the tremendous work from the field of early intervention providers and the exemplary and caring oversight of the Birth to 3 Program at the county level, Wisconsin has now demonstrated that the early intervention program, Birth to 3, meets requirements of the Individuals With Disabilities Act (IDEA) Part C in the new determination status issued by the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) June 5th. Celebrations are in order. Your certificate of award, celebrating your county status of "Meeting Requirements" is attached.

Wisconsin has a long-standing history and commitment to quality services for young children and their families. County agencies are key partners in the process through the delivery of effective early intervention services in partnership with families and community providers. We have seen increased attention being paid to the data collection and reporting process. Counties have done an exemplary job this year in carefully attending to data documentation requirements and demonstrating through the data the excellent practices in providing early intervention services to children in the Birth to 3 system. Congratulations on a job well done!

As you know, OSEP has required states to enforce the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) by making local determinations under IDEA sections 616(b) and 642 annually on the performance of each early intervention program under Part C. States are required to consider a county's performance on compliance indicators 1, 7, 8, 9, valid, reliable and timely data, and audits when making determinations. Wisconsin is now able to celebrate a change in determination status to "Meets Requirements" through our demonstrated progress in the IDEA requirements, documented in the FFY 2007 APR.

A chart has been attached to help understand and analyze Green Lake County's performance on each Indicator. This data was reported and posted in the dashboard format on the North Central Regional Resource Center (NCRRC) site, as in past years.

Green Lake County has "Met Requirements" this year, based on your July 1, 2007, through June 30, 2008 data, and/or analysis of more current data run in March, 2009. Counties needed to meet requirements according to the formula in the attached chart on at least 8 of the 9 measures.

Green Lake County continues to provide exemplary services to children. We look forward to working together to collect data that reflects the high quality of services rendered in your county to enhance the development of children and support families. You have our immense gratitude for your commitment to the children and families of your community.
