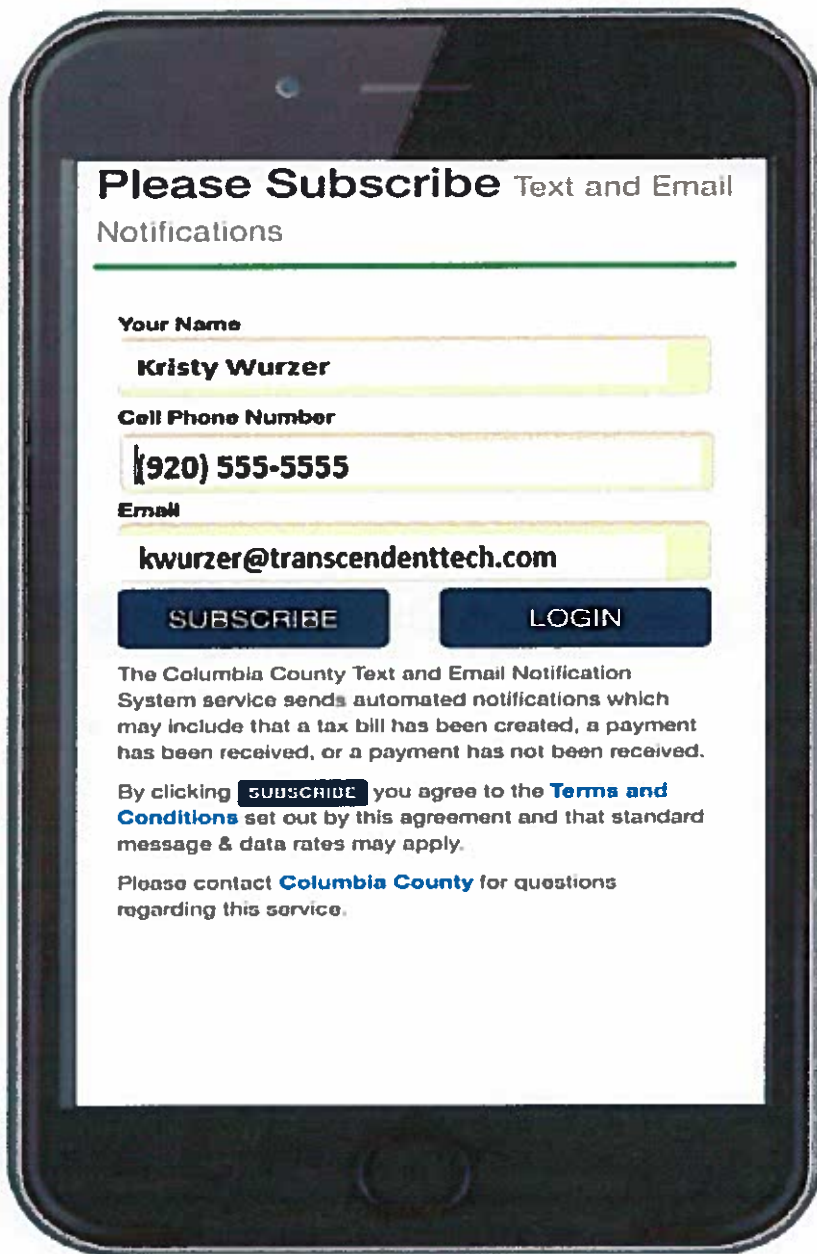

The Wisconsin Land Information Association (WLIA) is excited to be part of the effort to improve to NG911 services. Members of our organization have been part of the initial effort to build and maintain current Geographic Information Systems (GIS) at the local level.

While the current platform of GIS is adequate for the current emergency services model, the NG911 system has far more stringent data requirements that will place additional financial and logistical demands on local governments. Going forward, there is an urgent need for:

- Funding – WLIA is strongly advocating that Department of Military Affairs to include funding in the State of Wisconsin 2021-2023 Biennial Budget request, to provide grant funding to local governments. This funding will provide the necessary resources that will allow counties and municipalities to start the effort to meet the enhanced GIS mapping requirements of NG911.

Attached is a white paper which the WLIA Board of Directors has approved for your review. In it you will find more specific details regarding our stance on NG911.

White paper: GIS data enhancement for Wisconsin's NG911 system

Executive Summary:

The State of Wisconsin has made progress towards the next evolution of 911 services, the creation of a Next Generation 9-1-1 (NG911) system. As part of the State of Wisconsin's Biennial Budget process, additional funding will be critical for the Department of Military Affairs (DMA) to further this initiative. A major component of the NG911 system is the use of advanced digital mapping, called Geographic Information Systems (GIS). The current 911 system for call answering, locating, and routing was developed, in part, using Wisconsin Land Information Program (WLIP) funding which did much to build and support GIS at the local level.

However, the NG911 system has far more stringent data requirements that will place additional financial and logistical demands on local governments. These requirements will require funding far beyond what can be provided by the WLIP. Additional funding over and above what the WLIP provides is absolutely necessary to properly build and maintain NG911.

Introduction and background:

This purpose of this white paper is to provide notice of the GIS needs for the creation and maintenance of a NG911 system in Wisconsin. The Wisconsin Land Information Association (WLIA) has been a strong advocate for the land records community in the state. WLIA has been working with DMA on the GIS requirements for a NG911 system through the WLIA NG911 Task Force. WLIA is very encouraged by the work that has been done to this point and will continue to work closely with DMA as the effort continues.

WLIA continues to update and educate its members on what NG911 would mean for local governments and the state. With that, there is growing concern in regard to the resources needed to meet the stringent requirements for NG911. The WLIP has made great strides in the development and maintenance of GIS data at the local level. This data has become an integral part of county and municipal government in the support and management of systems across the state including Tax Parcel services, Public online mapping, 911 Computer Aided Dispatch, etc. However, the local data standards have been driven, in large part, by limited departmental and/or vendor specific requirements.

Enhancing the local data to meet the needs of a statewide NG911 system will place additional burdens on local governments. The creation of a NG911 system points to the need for a central state agency that can fill the role of the data collector, aggregator and broker and provide the needed bridge to local governments and state agencies in the development of a broad reaching GIS system for Wisconsin.

Case studies/lessons learned:

In 2013, Act 20 established the Wisconsin Statewide Tax Parcel Initiative. This initiative established an implementation plan and funding for a statewide digital parcel map, as a collaborative effort with local governments. It created a complete, accurate, and continuously maintained digital parcel map that would protect and grow Wisconsin's \$460 billion in taxable real estate assets, improve governmental services, and enhance the state's economic competitiveness. This initiative leveraged the existing work done at the local level to produce a statewide tax parcel dataset that was not previously available. It demonstrated that with the establishment of a statewide data standard and additional financial support, local data can be used to build statewide data that is more accurate with more current data.

This initiative provided a case study and model that can be built upon for the implementation of

the NG911. The Statewide Tax Parcel Initiative demonstrated that time and funding are critical components in the establishment of the statewide data. The establishment of Strategic Initiative Grant funding was a critical component to allow counties to enhance their data to a publishing standard. It was demonstrated that the earlier that counties have project requirements and funding the sooner that they can produce the data to that enhanced standard.

Policy context:

Current policy does not have specific funding source or grant program for GIS data enhancement to meet needs of NG911 implementation. The current Biennial Budget provided funding for the GIS gap analysis but did not provide funding for implementation of recommendations related to GIS data. If left to the status quo, another biennial budget will pass without addressing this issue resulting in delays of data readiness and implementation of recommendations to better position local governments for a statewide NG911 system.

Policy options and recommendations:

In 2019 a grant program was proposed under DMA for funding Public Safety Answering Point (PSAP) equipment upgrades to support NG911. The funding source is the police and fire protection fund at \$7M annually for the 2019-21 biennium. Under the grant program, it would be DMA's role to award grants and promulgate rules to identify appropriate purposes for the grants based on the recommendations of the 911 subcommittee.

The GIS Gap Analysis was included in the 2019-21 Biennial Budget under DMA. At the time DMA estimated an approximate cost of PSAP equipment upgrades and GIS data enhancements of \$32M. DMA indicated the funding to implement these components would be requested during a future biennial budget. Our concern is that deferring a request for any funding for the advancement of GIS data until after the Gap Analysis is completed would delay improvements of critical GIS data for NG911 by another two years. Including funding in the 2021-23 budget would allow progress to be made on priorities identified in the final Gap Analysis report.

Our request is for DMA to include a budget line item for GIS data enhancement for the 2021-23 Biennial Budget. This budget item would not provide the entire funding needed for a statewide GIS data standardization for NG911. WLIA is hopeful that the final Gap Analysis report will provide the greater budgetary recommendations. However, it would provide some initial funding to local land information offices to make progress each year towards meeting the NG911 standards for address points and street centerlines. It is suggested that this funding would be made available through a proposed DMA grant program and would require recipients to meet certain standards and timelines.

Implementation and next steps:

The WLIA would encourage additional funding be identified in the DMA budget for GIS in support of the NG911 initiative. This new funding would provide grants to local units of government for the enhancement of data needed in NG911. This would provide needed assistance to the counties.

Land Information Officers must begin the work required to enhance data and workflows to meet the needs of NG911. As past initiatives have demonstrated, the sooner that work can begin, the sooner statewide data can be built. The WLIA is currently advocating for the following items:

- Provide \$3 million in each year of the Biennial Budget to assist local units of government (approximately \$40,000 per county per year).
- Grant program administered by the Department of Military Affairs and distributed through DOA-WLIP.
- Focus on cooperation between municipalities and counties by focusing on workflows. Data developed within these improved workflows would then be sent to the state.

Conclusion:

The State of Wisconsin continues to work towards a future NG911 system. The implementation of NG911 will require local governments to develop and maintain an advanced GIS mapping system to support a statewide system. This will require funding far beyond what can be provided by the WLIP. To meet these needs, the WLIA is **STRONGLY** advocating that DMA include funding in the State of Wisconsin 2021-2023 Biennial Budget request, to provide grant funding to local governments. This will provide the necessary resources that will allow counties to meet the enhanced GIS mapping requirements of NG911.
